

Summary of Proceedings

- 1. **Opening Remarks:** The DG of KanInvest, representing the Governor, opened the meeting with remarks on the importance of BERAP for Kano State's economic growth. Abduljabbar Umar emphasized collaboration between the public and private sectors to drive reform success.
- 2. **Overview of BERAP Objectives and Vision:** KanInvest presented BERAP's objectives, focusing on regulatory transparency, digital service accessibility, and fostering investment through public-private partnerships.
- 3. Progress Updates:
 - Access to Information: The Judiciary shared efforts to digitize public records.
 - Enhanced Regulatory Reforms: The Ministry of Commerce reported a reduction in business registration times.
 - **PPP Law:** KanInvest shared progress on the PPP law, expected to streamline collaboration between Kano State and private businesses.
- 4. **Challenges and Solutions:** MDAs discussed resource limitations and technical challenges. Private sector representatives offered support in logistics and ICT expertise.
- 5. **Private Sector Engagement:** Discussions with private sector representatives on potential roles in supporting BERAP goals.
