MEETING REPORT FOR THE 2024 BUSINESS ENABLING REFORMS ACTION PLAN (BERAP) STAKEHOLDERS CONSULTATION

Event: Stakeholders' Consultation for BERAP 2024

Date: 22nd October 2023

Venue: Millennium Hall, Tahir Guest Palace, Kano **Attendance:** 17 Participants, Representing Various MDAs and

Private Sector Entities

1. Introduction and Objectives

The consultation meeting for the Kano State Business Enabling Reforms Action Plan (BERAP) 2024 was held with the objective of aligning stakeholders from various sectors towards achieving a business-friendly environment. This meeting served as a crucial platform for discussing the challenges, setting priorities, and defining actionable plans that support business growth and attract investment to Kano State.

2. Opening Remarks

The session commenced with an address by Abduljabbar Umar, Director General of KanINVEST. His opening remarks emphasized the government's commitment to reform policies that would simplify business procedures, improve regulatory efficiency, and create a favorable environment for both local and international investors.

3. Overview of BERAP 2024 Goals

An overview of BERAP 2024 was provided, outlining the primary goals for the upcoming year. These included:

- Enhancing the ease of business registration and licensing processes.
- · Reducing bureaucratic bottlenecks across key sectors.
- Improving access to financial services and investment incentives.
- Strengthening support for small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).
- Implementing transparent and accessible grievance redress mechanisms.

4. Participant Profile and Attendance Breakdown

The attendance was comprised of 17 representatives, including officials from key MDAs (Ministries, Departments, and Agencies) and private sector representatives. The breakdown of participants is as follows:

Each participant's contact information was verified and documented, including their name, designation, and organization. Representatives ranged from high-level government officials to CEOs and legal advisors in the private sector, ensuring diverse perspectives in the consultation.

5. Activity Summary

- a. Presentation of Current Business Environment Challenges Representatives from KanINVEST presented a detailed analysis of the current business climate in Kano State, highlighting key areas that require reform. Challenges discussed included:
 - Delays in business registration and licensing processes.
 - · High tax burdens on small businesses.
 - Limited access to loans and grants for local enterprises.
 - Bureaucratic delays within government offices impacting business operations.
- b. Breakout Session on Sector-Specific Reforms

Participants were divided into breakout groups to focus on specific sectors and propose targeted reforms. The sectors covered included Agriculture, Finance, Infrastructure Development, and Legal/Regulatory Framework. Each group discussed the main barriers affecting their respective sectors and proposed solutions. For instance:

- Agriculture: Participants recommended subsidized loans and streamlined land acquisition processes.
- Finance: The Finance group emphasized the need for tax incentives and simplified tax filing procedures for SMEs.
- c. Stakeholder Feedback on Proposed Reforms

Following the breakout sessions, stakeholders reconvened to share insights from their group discussions. Key feedback from the participants included:

- The necessity for a one-stop-shop approach to business registration to reduce time and costs.
- Improved collaboration between government agencies and private sector partners for streamlined operations.
- Regular training sessions for MDA staff to ensure better service delivery and customer relations.
- d. Development of Actionable Roadmap

The session concluded with the drafting of a tentative roadmap for BERAP 2024, which includes:

- Timeline for Reforms: Targeting the implementation of major reforms by mid-2024.
- Performance Metrics: Establishing KPIs to measure the success of each reform action.
- Agency Responsibilities: Assigning roles to specific MDAs for efficient coordination.

6. Key Decisions and Next Steps

- 1. Prioritization of Reforms: Immediate reforms will focus on tax incentives, streamlined licensing processes, and digitalization of MDA services.
- 2. Grievance Redress Mechanism: A robust system similar to Reportgov.ng is planned for Kano State, aiming to improve public feedback mechanisms and accountability in service delivery.
- 3. Periodic Review Meetings: It was agreed to conduct quarterly review meetings to monitor progress and address emerging challenges.

7. Closing Remarks

The meeting concluded with closing remarks from Hamid Sidi Alli, who acknowledged the collaborative efforts of all participants and reiterated the importance of sustained commitment towards achieving the BERAP 2024 objectives.
